

STUDENT COUNCIL ELECTIONS

The Student Council Elections at Gurukulam represent a significant annual tradition that embodies democratic values and leadership development among students. Following the institution's established protocols, elections were successfully conducted on September 18, 2024 and 2025, initiating with a formal notification for nominations from eligible second-year students. The electoral process was meticulously organized with a structured administrative team, including a Presiding Officer, Polling Officer, Assistant Polling Officer, and Counting Officer, ensuring a transparent and fair election process. The election encompassed various crucial leadership positions, General Secretary, CPL, Vice-CPL, Photography leader and several portfolio leaders responsible for sports Captains Sports Secretary, Hygiene Captain sick Secretary, food Captain &, cultural activities, and academic affairs. Students participated enthusiastically in the democratic process, casting their votes through a formal ballot system under strict supervision, demonstrating their understanding of civic responsibility and democratic participation. Following the polling process, the counting of votes was conducted with utmost precision by designated counting officers in the presence of witnesses, maintaining the integrity of the electoral process. The results were promptly declared, identifying the successful candidates who would form the new Student Council. The culmination of the election process was marked by a formal oath-taking ceremony on September 18, 2024, where the Principal officially inducted the newly elected leaders into their respective positions.





















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
