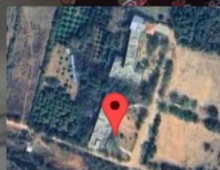


Students and Teachers Gathering on Constitution Day-2022

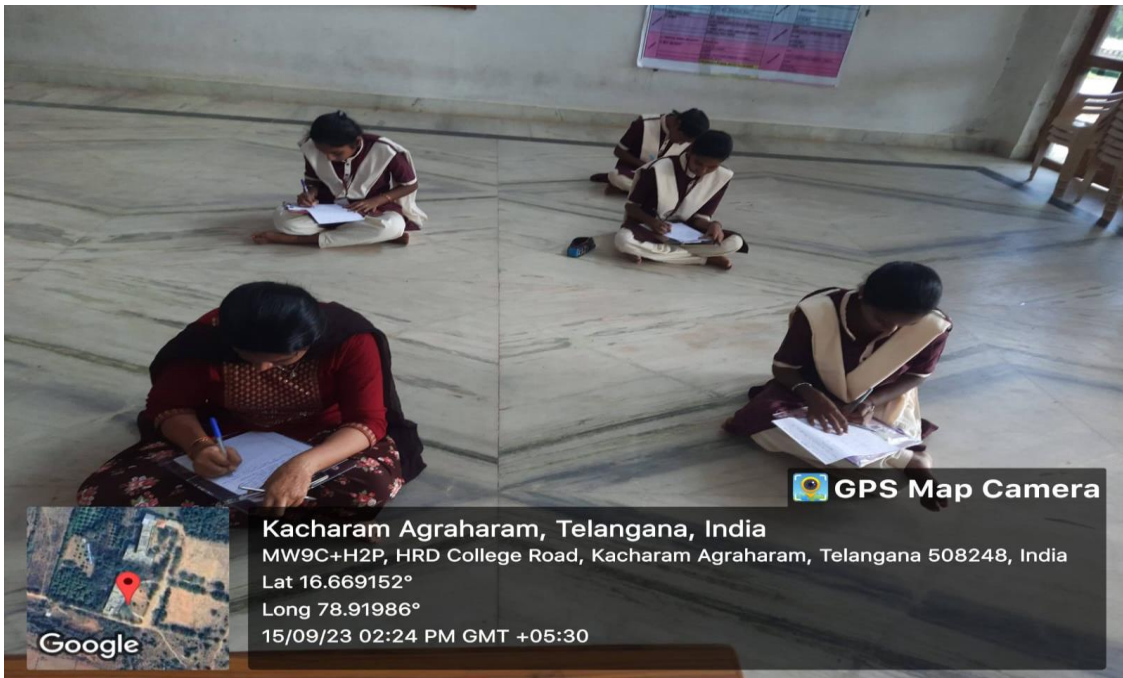

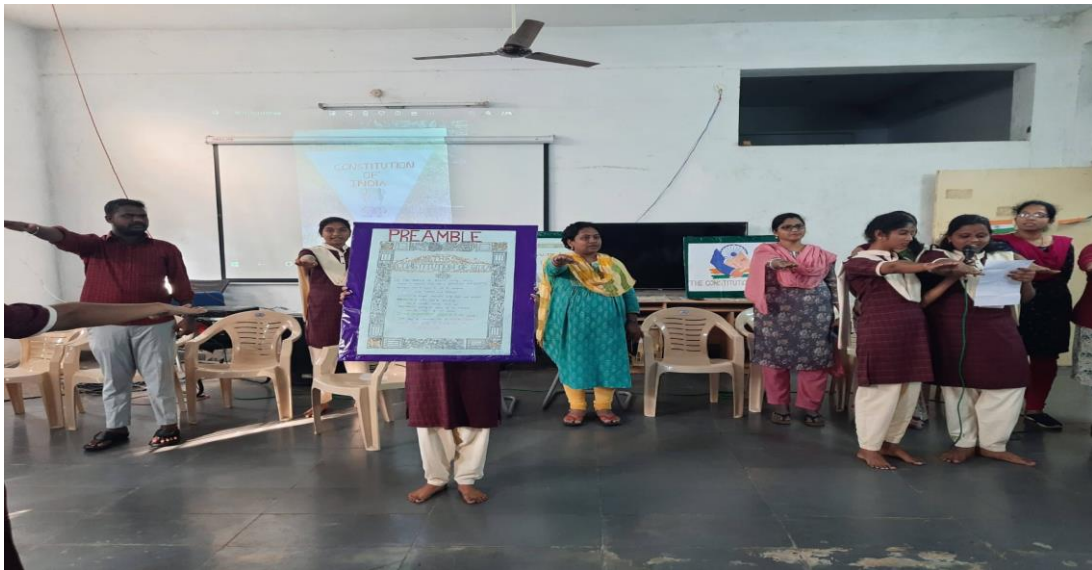

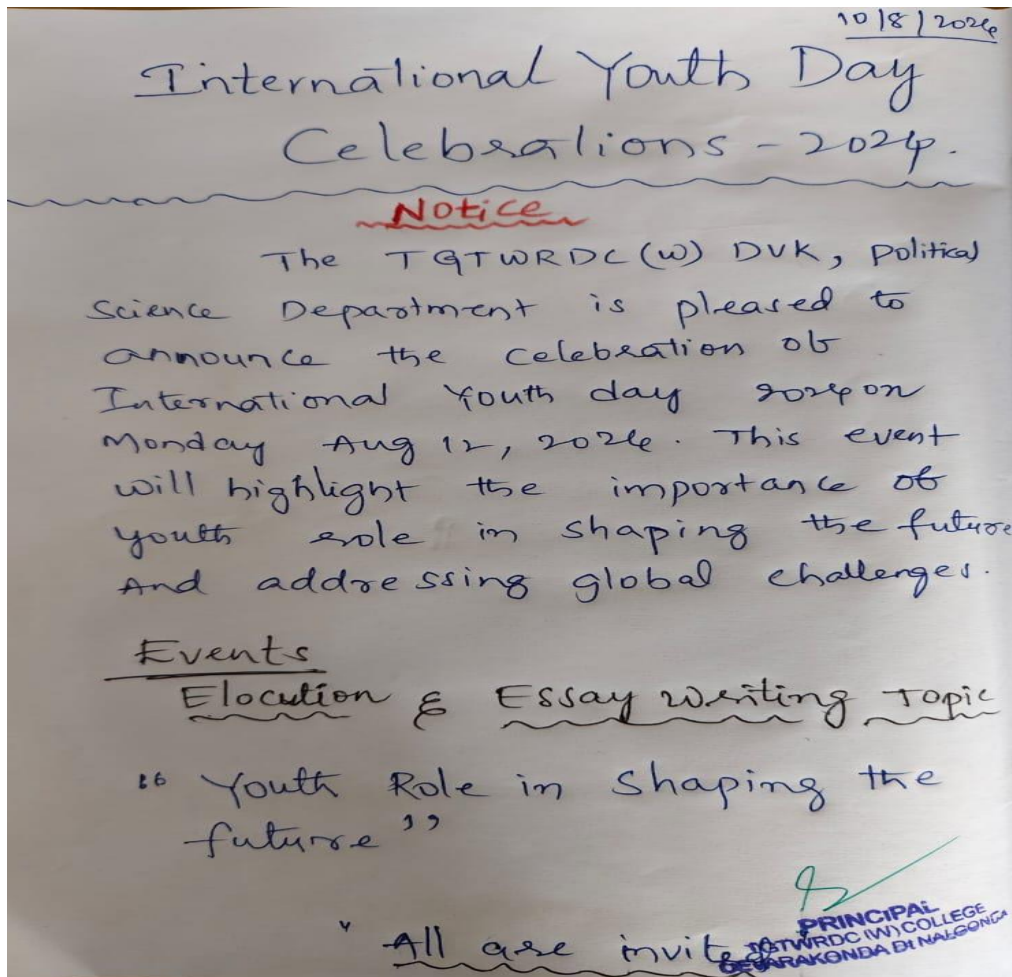
