Community Outreach Club

Objectives of the practice

- Community Outreach is about giving, contributing and helping those who cannot help themselves.
- It makes the students understand various problems of the society.
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- It makes students responsible towards their fellow citizens, their community and society in general

Visit to Bethelu Orphanage 21st September, 2019

 The first programme was a visit to Bethelu Orphanage at Domakonda. Students interacted with old women and children who were staying in that orphanage. The students also handed over biscuits and chocolates to them.



Reaching the poorest at Kamareddy Railway station 20th October 2019

- This was a tough programme. Students were not willing to meet the poorest people, especially the beggars. However, some students came forward and interacted with the poorest people, at the Railway Station in Kamareddy.
- There were few, who were willing to work, but had no work and took shelter at the station and often begged to survive. Two women were thrown out of their houses and were forced to beg.
- Some sold vegetables and fruits in lesser quantity and made a respectful living. We distributed pulihora/lemon rice and bananas to them and they were very happy to receive them.



Visit to Devanpalli Police Station 3rd November 2019

- The second programme was a visit to Devanpalli Police Station in Kamareddy District. Students interacted with the police officers with several questions.
- Police are considered as a part of the state apparatus and thus they are not given an ear to hear their problems. They face several hardships and also sacrifice their lives for the sake of duty.
- The students spoke to the policemen and asked about the life style of a police officer, their daily routine and so on. Life of a policeman is often taken for granted. They are expected to be present everywhere to ensure that crimes don't take place.
- Finally, they also asked the Police officer to advice on choosing the job of a policeman as a career. The officer said that it gives them great satisfaction, when they help someone in need and that drives them to do the job in spite of several hardships.



Interacting with the Fruit Vendors at Kamareddy Bus Stand 10th November, 2019

- The students prepared a questioner and approached the fruit vendors at Kamareddy bus stop and came to know about their life style, the business and their problems.
- Our students requested the fruit vendors not to use polythene bags for packing the fruits, which are harmful to the environment. Some vendors were using newspapers to wrap the fruits.
- Further, we met a young woman who had a basket of fruits to sell. She took the questioner from the hands of the students and read them in English. She had completed her intermediate in English medium. However, she was now selling fruits.



Interaction and Community Service to the Farmers 24th November 2019

- Students have been watching a woman with her son, working hard thrashing paddy, in the farm opposite to the college.
- The students approached to help the farmer. They worked in the field for an hour and came back.
- The lady was working in others farm and she was there with her son to collect the fodder from the field after thrashing the paddy. This served as fodder for her cattle.



Interaction with Lorry Drivers Creating Awareness on Respecting and Safeguarding Women 5th January, 2020

- This was the toughest programme conducted by the club. Students interacted with lorry drivers Ganj Market Yard. They first talked about their life style.
- Then, they brought the topic of Disha case and enquired, how they would react if they find lonely women and girls.
- The lorry drivers said that everybody is not same. They assured that they will help any women if they approach them.
- Finally, they pledged to respect and save women.



Awareness Programme on Corona Virus Hand Wash Techniques to the students at TTWURJC Nagireddypet 7th March 2020

- As the cases of Covid-19 were coming up in India, we realised that we should create awareness among children on this.
- We chose the sister institution, Nagireddypet school near the college and taught children about the hand wash technique approved by WHO.
- We also created awareness on preventive measures amidst the growing threat of Corona virus.
- Lastly, we made all the students and a few staff members to wash their hands with liquid soap and the technique taught by our students.

Village Learning Centres

- Our college TTWRDC (M) Kamareddy started a unique programme called 'Village Learning Centres', during corona pandemic.
- Education was most affected area during the pandemic period and among the students, it was the poorest who suffered the most.
- While, the students of urban areas, and the middle classes had access to online classes and other online programmes to keep updated with their education, the students from lower income levels specially in the rural areas were devoid of any source to continue their education.

Objectives

- To provide uninterrupted education to the students coming from rural background, marginal sections, low income groups.
- To keep children and student teachers engaged in effective learning process during the serious period of covid 19.
- To ensure the children and student teachers learn about safe and secure measures to keep themselves away from being affected by covid 19.

Practice

- The best students from each class were selected by the respective housemasters and trained for the programme through online mode using whatsapp chat.
- Topics and timetables are designed and distributed to the students with general suggestions to be implemented during the classes.
- Each student could gather the children from their neighbourhood and classes are conducted on a daily basis preferably in the evening time.

Problems encountered and resources required

- The programme encountered problems at the initial stages. The villages were not willing to send their children to the village learning centres.
- However with the help of the village head and other important people of the village the parents started sending their students to the village learning centres.
- Some students were able to use the classrooms of the government schools with the permission of village head and the school officials. Others had to conduct these VLCs in and around their homes.

Success

- This programme kept the rural children updated with their education by encouraging them to take daily classes and practice sessions.
- A total of 18 VLCs were successfully carried on and 166 students of the thandas benefitted from this programme.
- Our student-teachers got a first-hand experience of teaching on a regular basis which enhanced their teaching skills and their confidence levels.
- This programme was also covered in the newspapers and encouraged other people to take up such measures to ensure that the students from lower income group and marginal section of the society to access to uninterrupted education during the pandemic period

Village Learning Centre at Dubba Thanda

- During lockdown our college started a new programme called village learning centres.
- Dubba Thanda in Gandhari Mandal of Kamareddy district.
- Student of BA final year M Sudhakar organised the Independence Day programme. Children from the Village Learning Centre run by M Sudhakar participated in the programme.
- A story telling session was conducted. They were later given sweets also.

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
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Cycle Rally Awareness on Energy Conservation 5th December 2022


