

ADMISSION CRITERIA.

For admission in the organization—the following data is collected from
the beneficiaries.

- * The family history of the child
- * Contact number
- * Aadhar number of parents.

ACTIVITIES CARRIED OUT IN THE AGANWADI

- 1) Registration of ANC mothers at 3 months
- 2) Registration of PNC and breastfeeding mother post-delivery
- 3) Registration of children from the age of 6 months to 3 years
- 4) Registration of children from the age of 3 years to 6 years for pre-school education.
- 5) Registration of adolescent girls from the age group of 11 years to 18 years with the help of ASHA workers. Hemoglobin, weight is assessed for adolescent girls as well as register is maintained and medication are given if necessary.

- 6) Total home ration is provided to ANC mother, children from the age of 6 months to 5 years and adolescent girls which include gram, wheat, chana, sugar Powder, Chilli Powder, salt, masoor dal.
- 7) Deworming of children. is done once in every 6 month and record is maintained.
- 8) Supplementary nutrition diet week and breast-feeding week is celebrated once in a year in august.
- 9) Survey of the area is done and ASHA visits five houses daily.



Pre-School Education

Non-formal pre school education is an important component of ICDS programme which is essential for all round development of the children. Pre-school education is provided to children in the age group of 3 to 6 years. As the name suggests formal education is not important to the children but children are encouraged to grow at their own pace. The anganwadi should thus become the first step in the process of education before the child goes to primary school.
