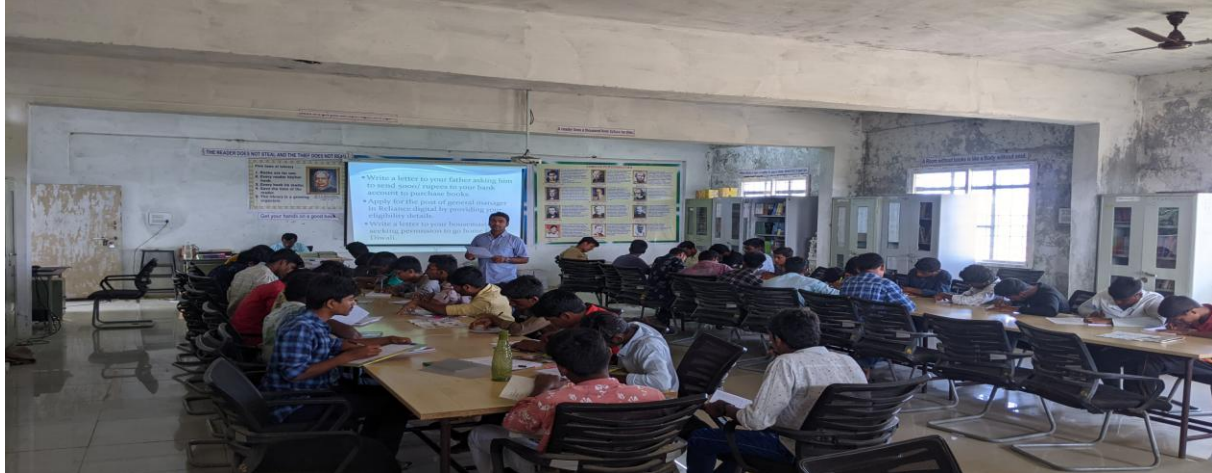

**Bridge Course:** Realizing the significance of English & basic Arithmetic, Gurukulam organizes, Bridge program for the newly admitted 1<sup>st</sup> semester students. Gurukulam designed an intensive 10 days Bridge course covering elemental but quintessential topics in English such as parts of speech, punctuation, tenses, writing correspondence, communication skills etc. to equip the students with basic skills for effective quotidian conversation.
