CLUB ACTIVITIES



OBJECTIVES:

- To nurture leadership and creativity skills in students.
- To enhance their thought and speech through E-Plus Club and Literary Club.
- To encourage students' skills for creative writing and expression.
- To facilitate enjoyment and promote cultural diversity through the Music and Dance Club.
- To nurture young talent, build confidence, develop creative skills and independence through a range of art and design activities in Creative Club.
- To think critically, prepare students for career and create professionals that can work across scientific disciplines to solve challenging problems.
- To help students to improve their production and performance skills.
- To encourage students to perform dramatic presentations such as skits, mime, and plays.

- To restore and enhance the social functioning of people living in situations of poverty through community outreach.
- To help students to build sportsmanship spirit
- To develop teamwork and organizing skills and relieve stress.

THE CONTEXT:

- ❖ Literary Club is a place to read and write classic literature, here students enroll themselves in the club and participate in activities like poetry writing, fiction writing, discuss-classic writings, authors, lyrics etc., recitation of poetry, collection of idioms.
- ❖ Music and Dance club is a place to learn the history of dance forms, teaching choreography and music and participate in activities like classic dance forms, western dance, folk dance and also music.
- ❖ Creative Club is a place to show out art and craft, painting, movies, all the club activities like writing and editing content, learning photo-shop techniques, learning arts, screening national and international movies, documentary movies and short films, movie review writing and discussions.
- ❖ Theatre Club is a place where it helps students to develop their creative thoughts and ideas and here students do role plays, practicing one act play, workshops and drama.
- ❖ STEMS Club encourages students to do theory and practice, creating the products associated with daily life. Here students are encouraged to organize science fairs, mock elections, and organize seminars.
- ❖ Community Outreach helps to make students empathize with the real problems of the society where students visit orphanages, old age homes, balasadanam etc.
- ❖ Mirror project is an activity which helps students to practice how to speak on any topic in front of the mirror which makes them understand their body posture, and helps them to develop their personality.
- ❖ E-Plus is an activity where students are given with some latest current topics, students will give their opinion whether it is positive or negative, they share their view.
- ❖ Manuscript Magazine is an activity where students are given topics and only interested students write on the given topic and make it a magazine. Every month one new title is displayed on the notice board.
- ❖ Academic clubs is a place where students can expand their network to gain subject matter and expertise. It also encourages students to build strong mentor-ship and relationship with faculty and other students.
- ❖ Entrepreneurship club is to help students to develop entrepreneurial qualities, nurture their talent and develop awareness of the skills and values of successful entrepreneurs.

PRACTICE:

Each faculty member should mentor student clubs.

- Students who ever enrolled in clubs up to the maximum limit of the club should consider as a club member.
- The strength of the club will not be less than 10 students and not more than 35 students. Remaining students will be on another Committee like Healthy Thursday.
- Each club should meet on every Saturday and do some club activities.
- The role of the faculty member is to maintain order and focus during the meetings and intervene only in cases of disorder or conflict.
- The agenda of the meeting and club activities should be handled entirely by the students (with no or minimal inputs from the faculty mentor).
- With regard to the budget for club activities, requests from faculty mentors may be sent for resources required for club activities. All reasonable requests will be funded through principals.
- Club members should showcase their activities at the end of the month as mentioned in the calendar.
- Annual club showcase is also arranged according to the calendar where each club showcases its activities on a day and the best club will be awarded.
- Each club is headed by President, Vice President and treasurer. These roles are filled by club elections every year.
- President who is appointed as the leader of the club is responsible to coordinate with the Vice President, Treasurer and members to run the activities.
- Vice president will share equal responsibilities with the President. Treasurer is responsible to maintain the records and also the financial quotient.
