Our undergraduate courses operate on a semester system for both teaching and evaluation. The academic year is split into two semesters, each of which includes two internal examinations and one end-semester examination.

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) Overview

Introduction

The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) was introduced at the college from the academic year 2019 and continues to the present. This system provides a flexible approach to higher education, allowing students to tailor their learning experiences according to their interests and career goals.

Features

- 1. Elective Courses:** Students can choose from a range of elective courses, allowing them to diversify their knowledge and skills beyond their core subjects for holistic development and greater mobility.
- 2. Global Standards:** The system aligns with global education standards, making education broad-based and internationally comparable.

Course Structure

- ****Core Courses**:** Mandatory courses required for the completion of a program in a specific discipline.
- ****Elective Courses**:** Courses chosen from a pool of papers. These include:
 - ****Generic Elective**:** Courses from unrelated disciplines.
 - ****Discipline Centric Elective**:** Courses from the main discipline.
- ****Ability Enhancement Courses**:**

Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course: For Knowledge enhancement(mandatory)

Skill Enhancement Courses: value-based and skill-based

- ****Compulsory Courses**:** Mandatory courses for knowledge enhancement.

- ****Skill Enhancement Courses**:** Courses focused on value-based and skill-based learning.

SEC papers Max Marks:40 (Int:10 ESE:40) only one internal will be conducted.

Examination and Grading

- ****Passing Marks**:** Minimum of 40% to pass.

- ****No Supplementary Exams**:** For students who have completed 6 semesters.

- ****Grade Reporting**:**

- Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) is shown if no paper is failed.

- Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is awarded after passing all papers across 6 semesters.

- Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) grades are included in both SGPA and CGPA.

- Final results display only grades and credits, not marks.

Examination System

The examination system consists of Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) and End Semester Assessment (ESA).

Theory Papers

- ****Total Marks****: 100

- ****CIA****: 20 marks

- ****ESA****: 80 marks

- ****CIA Components****:

- Internal I Exam: 20 marks

- Internal II Exam: 20 marks

- Total CIA Marks: (Internal I + Internal II) / 2 = 20 marks

- ****ESA****:

- Written exam for 80 marks with a duration of 3 hours.

- Minimum of **32** marks (40%) out of 80 in ESA and a total of 32 marks out of 100 (CIA + ESA) required to pass.

Practical Papers

- ****Total Marks****: 50

- ****CIA****: 50 marks (includes viva-voce, record submission, execution)

- Practical exam for 50 marks with a duration of 3 hours.

- Minimum of 20 marks (40%) out of 50 in ESA required to pass.

****Note**:** No re-examination for absentees in both theory and practical internals.

This structure ensures that students receive a well-rounded education, meeting both academic and skill-based requirements, while maintaining rigorous assessment standards.
