- Lack of proper ventilation, exposure to harmful chemicals, and absence of safety measures pose significant health risks to bidi workers, impacting their overall well-being.

3. Household Expenses:

- Despite low incomes, bidi workers face considerable household expenses, including food, shelter, healthcare, and education for their families.
- Meeting these expenses often requires bidi workers to resort to borrowing money or relying on informal sources of credit, further exacerbating their financial hardships.

4. Access to Social Security:

• Bidi workers have limited access to social security benefits such as health insurance, pension schemes, and unemployment benefits.

5. Industry Contribution:

- The bidi industry constitutes only 0.65% of the total gross value added (GVA) by the entire manufacturing industry.
- Employment in this sector mainly occurs through contractors.

6. wage Disparities:

• Bidi workers earn a mere 17% of the wages compared to workers in other manufacturing industries• - The absence of adequate social protection mechanisms leaves bidi workers and their families vulnerable to economic shocks and financial distress.

7. Analysis and recommendations

1. Income Augmentation:

• Efforts should be made to enhance the earning potential of bidi workers through skill development programs, access to alternative employment opportunities, and measures to improve productivity and market access.

2. Working Conditions Improvement:

• Measures should be taken to improve working conditions in bidi rolling units, including the implementation of safety regulations, provision of protective gear, and promotion of occupational health awareness.

3. Social Security Provision:

• Policy interventions are needed to extend social security coverage to bidi workers, ensuring access to healthcare, insurance, retirement benefits, and other social protection measures.

4. Financial Inclusion:

• Initiatives to promote financial literacy and inclusion among bidi workers can empower them to manage their finances better, access formal banking services, and build savings for emergencies and future needs

- Encourage increased registration of bidi industry units to ensure better tax administration.
- Prevention of exploitation of bidi workers is essential.
- Promote skill development programs for bidi workers to enhance job quality and wages.
