Event Name: NCC DAY

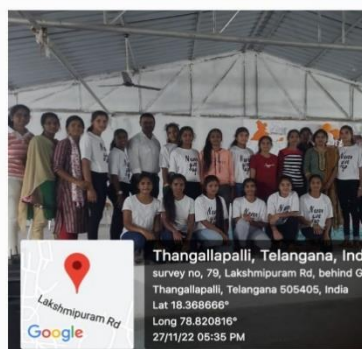
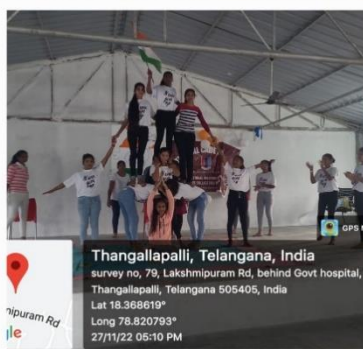
Date: 27th November 2022

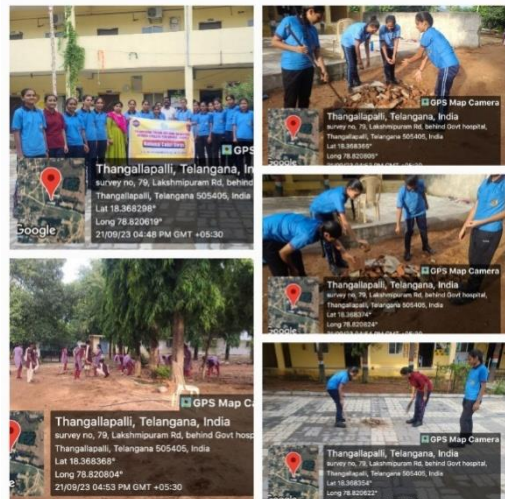
Event Name:SWACCHTA PAKHWADA
